

# Fast Flying Geese quilt



## Using 5" charm pack squares for Oakshott

From each 5" square you will be able to make two flying geese units.

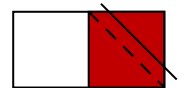
You need to cut the square in half (5" x 2 1/2") and then reduce both rectangles to 4 1/2"

For each rectangle you need to cut two squares from your background fabric at 2 1/2"

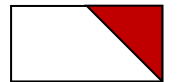
Make the flying geese as follows:

Take one background square and draw diagonal line across on the wrong side of the fabric.

Place the square, right side down across one end of the charm pack rectangle, and sew **down** the diagonal line.



Trim excess off corner giving yourself 1/4" seam



Press so that the background fabric now makes the rectangle shape as shown.

Place the other background square right side down on the other end of the rectangle, again draw the diagonal line and then sew **down** it. (it will overlap the original square) cut off excess and then press to form the flying geese unit.



There will be a 1/4" seam allowance at the apex top of the goose but NOT at each bottom edge.

Make as many as you think you need and lay out into a pleasing pattern.

Layer, quilt and bind
